



Candidate stands against rodeos

Giles candidate Esmond Vettoretti is running an independent campaign called No Rodeo.

Esmond's main endeavour with this campaign is to stop the cruelty animals experience at rodeo functions.

"I've been to a few rodeos and they haven't been that nice," Mr Vettoretti said.

"You see these animals (covered) with blood and injured.

"With all this (cruelty) going on and all these other problems going on I thought the Government weren't doing

much for the community.

"I have been campaigning for the last couple of days and all these people have been telling me (problems they have).

Mr Vettoretti said that he could make no promise to fix all the problems, however would love to be elected in so that he could see what he could do.

Mr Vettoretti is originally from New South Wales and has been living in Whyalla for the past five years.

He has a certificate in horticulture and has participated in

native revegetation and regeneration projects for local council.

He was a local council park ranger volunteer and spent seven years with the State Emergency Services in New South Wales.

He was awarded a certificate of recognition from the New South Wales premier for his involvement in the New South Wales bush fires around Sydney in 1994 and been an emergency volunteer for the Sydney 2000 Olympics.
